

The General Board of Assistants meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana was a very productive and informative gathering. Pat Friesen (our AG), Kenneth Whittemore, Jr. (Elder General) and I (Acting DGG) were in attendance.

The some of the main topics of the meeting were:

• Attracting & retaining members

• 2020 events & memorial – The membership voted for a bronze sculpture to be created as the 400th anniversary celebration of the landing of our Pilgrims. The Executive Committee will come up with a design for a bronze sculpture and bring it to the membership.

• Paying dues online – approved for General Society to pursue

• DNA Policy - great new policy

• The First Parish Church in Plymouth - First Parish Church in Plymouth is the oldest continuous church in New England. Very historic and very Pilgrim. It is currently owned by the Unitarian Universalist and unfortu-



nately, they are a very small congregation of fifty people and cannot keep up the expenses for the 1899 building. This is the fifth structure since 1684.

The UU went to Plymouth to have the town take over the meetinghouse/church. Plymouth cannot afford the upkeep and turned to the General Society of Mayflower Descendants. The UU will give the meetinghouse/church to the Mayflower Society. Our Society decided at this meeting to agree ONLY if we can raise at least three million dollars for the renovations needed and the expenses of the building. We will be looking into grants and donations. We will have the meetinghouse available for non-domination weddings and gatherings. Please watch the video about this historic meetinghouse/church:

Scholarship/Education

This year marks the beginning of a new era for California scholarships. The society has committed \$10,000 to the scholarship program every year—a first award of \$5000, second award of \$3000 and third award of \$2000. This is by far the largest scholarship allocation made by a state Mayflower society. Special thanks to Governor Pat Friesen, to Treasurer David Grinnell and to all of you for your support. I do want to remind everyone that the financial foundation of our scholarship program is still donations made to the Scholarship Fund by members when they pay their dues. I will be sending an email to all colony governors to stress this at the beginning of the calendar year. There are significant changes to the scholarship requirements this year; but the process for applying remains the same. All information and materials needed to apply is on the California Mayflower Society website; click on the scholarship link for the most current information. Applicants submit all their materials online. The deadline for submitting an application is March 1, 2017.

I am delighted that the three members of the 2016-2017 Scholarship Committee—Nancy Foley, Kathy Gire and Robert Dempster—have agreed to serve again this year. Each of them has been very helpful in modifying the scholarship requirements in ways that will help us in our evaluations this year. I look forward to working with them in the coming months.

Please also remember the GSMD scholarships--\$6,000 first award, \$4,000 second award, \$3,000 third award, \$2,000 four award. Information and materials to apply for is available on the GSMD website. Application deadline for the national scholarships is also March 1, 2017.

Looking for ideas for your colony activities or projects? Check the *Mayflower Education Gazette*, an online publication found on the GSMD Education Committee webpage, which also has useful links to resources for children and schools and to sources for Mayflower publications and information.

Each issue of the *Gazette* has a pattern and instructions for making a Mayflower article of clothing plus articles, games and other Mayflower resources. The *Gazette* is accessible to members who have registered as members of the Mayflower Society. After you log on as a GSMD member, click on Members Only, then click on the Committees link and the Education link.

Six issues of the *Gazette* are now on line to read or download; more issues will be added as new material becomes available. And where does this new material come from? The editors of the *Gazette* ask in every issue for suggestions from the state societies education chairs: what would you like to see in the *Gazette*? I have the same request: what resources—information, links--would you like to have on the California society website that is not currently available? Any ideas you have for the *Gazette* I will pass on to the editors; and I will try to provide any resources you would like to see added to the state website.

Data Processing South

Sometimes things happen, and you don't understand the complete ramifications of what is happening. When it does and we have taken a very serious step without any discussion. For years cloud based data storage has been a growing trend, and we interact with it in ways we not only don't see, but no effort is made to tell us about it. A case in point is the Wells Fargo scandal where they opened millions of unauthorized accounts using cloud based data storage. They have been fined 185 million dollars and are under criminal investigation of what appears to be the tip of the iceberg. We are a nation at war and our data bases are constantly under attack. Every day that your computer is online it is updating security programs that supposedly no one can hack, but we know that is an illusion.

Microsoft wants to make more money and access your banking accounts so it has made Microsoft Office cloud based and you pay a monthly charge to use it. I received an updated roster for Los Angeles Colony by email that was prepared with the cloud based Microsoft Office and while I could open it in a web browser I could not download it onto my computer without opening an account with Microsoft. This means that the entire California Mayflower is now cloud based and accessible to hacking, plus we will all have to open accounts to read our personnel data.

Nobody is at fault here and Judy is doing a great job. She can still save Excel files in the older format and send them to us like David does so we can have them on our computers. There are other free programs that can do spreadsheet processing on our computers in the future if it becomes necessary.

The General Society's 2020 committee still pushing for the adoption in Congress of a commemorative coin. So far there has been limited support. At the same time, the representative in Congress for the district that includes Plymouth, has introduced a competitive bill, making our efforts more difficult.



We need to be aware that there are several groups also making plans, including "Massachusetts 400" and a similar group based in Plymouth. Our General Society comm. has solicited suggestions for some form of memorial in Plymouth, and these will be presented to the General Society meeting in Indianapolis for a final selection and approval.




